- Log on to AQA, OCR, Edexcel, WJEC



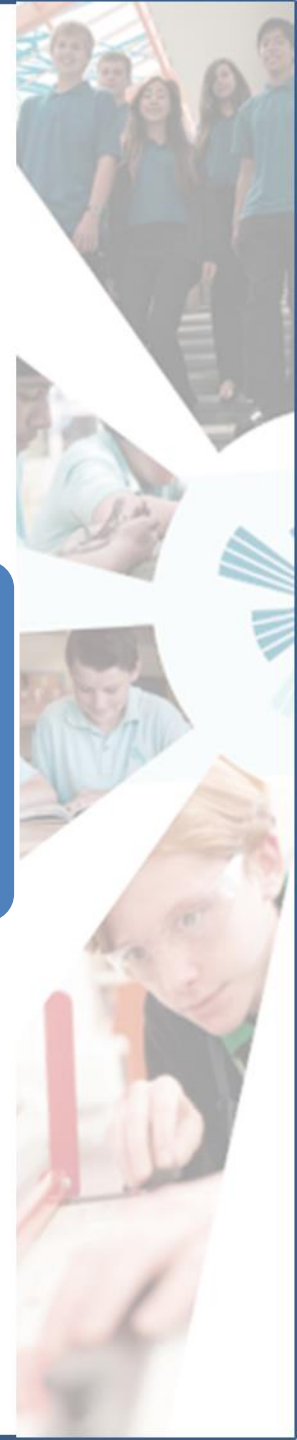
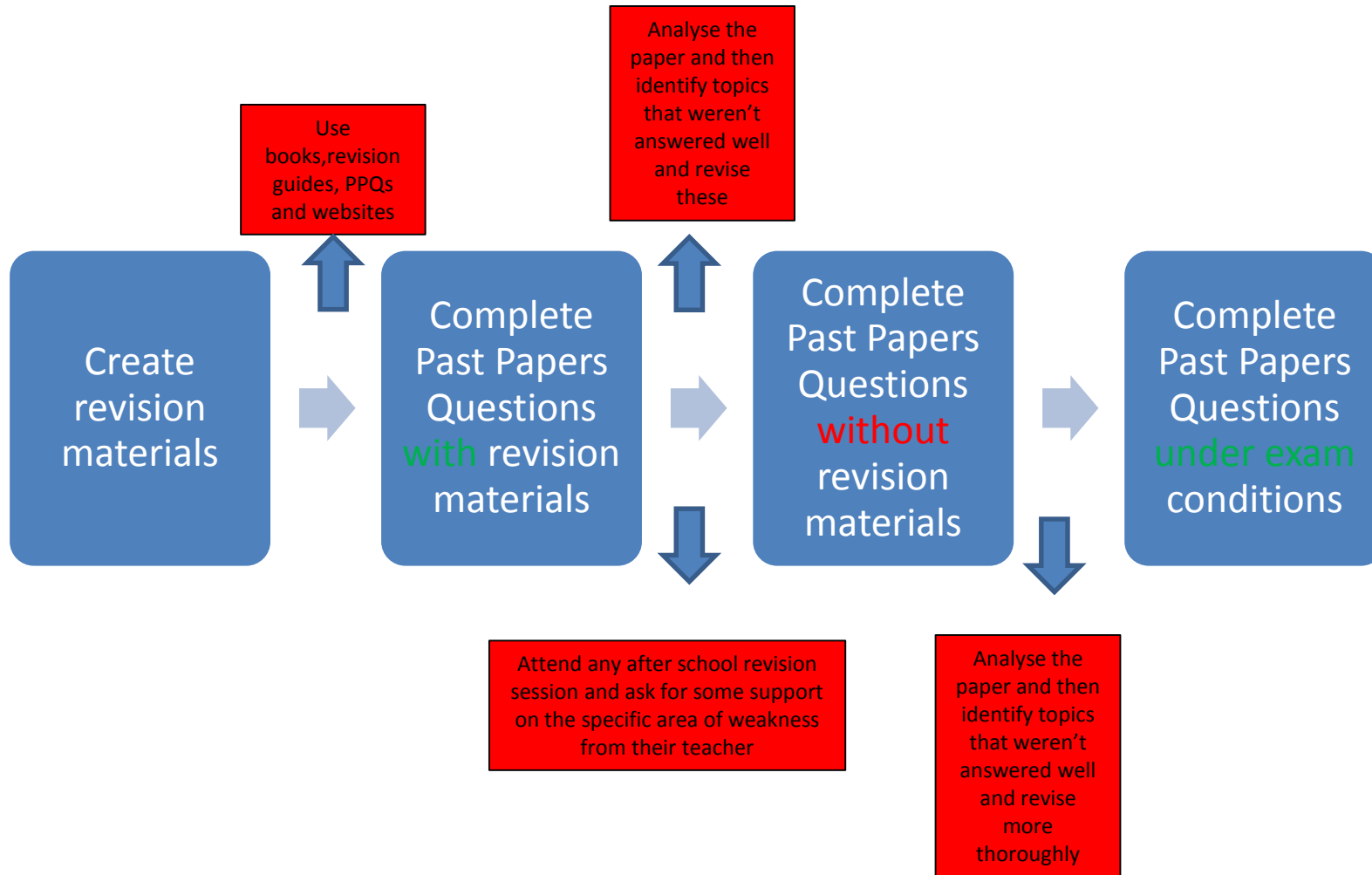


# Ensure they have the right environment

# Key points to planning a revision timetable

- How often?
- It must be realistic and achievable
- Factor in relaxation points
- What about their job?
- Focus on subject and revision style
- Works best if combined with their friends revision timetable
- Factor in the timings of their exams - see exam timetable
